

What a Night at Lifesavers!

We are thrilled to announce that the 11th Annual Lifesavers Dinner and Auction held August 6th at the Royal Lake of the Woods Yacht Club net *a record* \$305,000 for your hospital!

158 seasonal and local residents were hosted by event Chair, Catherine Konantz and Master of Ceremonies, Don Konantz. They were supported by a dynamic committee of Lisa Paterson, Melanie Sifton-Borger, Leslie Landell and Colin Foster.

Lifesavers Dinner and Auction was started in 2006 at Smith Camps by Bob Kozminski. The next year Nicki Douglas joined as co-chair and Lifesavers found its home at RLWYC. They chaired for 8 years before "retiring" but not before they secured the continuance of the event by passing the reins to Lisa Heimbecker who chaired in 2014, followed by co-chairs Catherine Konantz and Lisa Paterson in 2015 and in 2016 by Catherine.

Lifesavers Dinner and Auction has become LWDHF's largest fundraising event, accounting for over 60% of our annual fundraising goal this year! LWDH can now proceed with purchases of important medical equipment they would normally have to wait until further into our fundraising year to purchase.

Funds raised through Lifesavers have allowed LWDH to check off several items off their Wish List allowing for even more medical equipment purchases in the future as our annual fundraising campaigns continue. Funds raised through Lifesavers will equip patient care rooms with Patient Ceiling Lifts; purchase two (2) Infant Warmers/Resuscitation Beds; one (1) Fetal Monitor; a 50lb Washing Machine; Blood Bank System; Immunoassay Analyzer Backup; and a Coagulation Analyzer which tests a patients' ability to form a clot helping to determine course of treatment.

Patient ceiling lifts are an important component of the treatment plan for patients with reduced mobility. For patients, ceiling lifts allow for more frequent repositioning and transferring, thereby reducing pressure ulcers and ventilator associated pneumonia. For nurses, lifts increase staff productivity by allowing one nurse to transfer a patient rather than the two or four nurses required to perform a manual lift. Ceiling lifts also reduce caregiver injuries and allow caregivers to work later into their careers which increases staff retention.

20th Annual MNP/Hospital Foundation Charity Golf Classic

It was one of our hottest tournaments yet - sunny, cloudless skies and humid - but we sure had fun at our 20th Annual MNP/Hospital Foundation Charity Golf Classic! Thank you for raising \$43,000 for your hospital!

The Charity Golf Classic has celebrated many accomplishments over the last 19 years. Funds raised from our golf tournament has purchased over \$640,000 in important medical equipment for your hospital. Our loyal golfers, sponsors, donors and friends have made a difference in helping ensure that quality medical care remains available at Lake of the Woods District Hospital.

Our goal for this year's tournament was to raise the funds needed to purchase the Glidescope for Emergency Department; a Rapid Infusion Blood and Fluid Warmer for the Operating Room; and the Accuven Vein Viewer for the Emergency Department. And we did it!

The Rapid Infusion Blood and Fluid Warmer and the Accuven Vein Viewer are new technology for your hospital. This new piece of equipment is an advancement in technology for LWDH and is best practice in the OR. With the increase of major cases being done at LWDH, the Rapid Infuser will be an extremely valuable tool to maintain patient temperature during a long surgical case, by warming both fluid and blood at a rate *1000 times faster* than the current warmer.

The Accuven Vein Viewer displays a map of vasculature on the surface of skin which improves first stick success rate. This will benefit a wide range of patients who's vein may be difficult to see by the naked eye: pediatric, elderly, obese and patients whose skin tones are either very fair or very dark. The ER currently does not have a Vein Viewer.

Since 2010, Boobie Nights has raised over \$400,000 for your hospital! The DI Campaign focused on bringing Digital X-Ray and Mammography which has been installed and operating since January 2014 - thank you for making this essential service available in your community.

Boobie Nights has been essential in bringing Digital Mammography to the community, and now they've kicked off the CT Scan Campaign. The current CT Scan at LWDH is 11 years old, and replacement parts are no longer manufactured for repairs. This means that should something go down on the current CT Scan and a replacement part cannot be located, CT Scans would no longer be available at your hospital. Over 4,600 scans were performed at LWDH in 2015. This is an important piece of diagnostic equipment essential to maintaining the quality of care available at LWDH.

CT Scan Campaign

The next major campaign LWDHF is launching is the **new CT Scan for the Diagnostic Imaging Department**. The current CT Scan at LWDH is 11 years old, and replacement parts are no longer manufactured for repairs. This means that should something go down on the current CT Scan and a replacement part cannot be located, CT Scans would no longer be available at your hospital. Over 4,600 scans were performed at LWDH in 2015. This is an important piece of diagnostic equipment essential to maintaining the quality of care available at LWDH.

The new CT Scan will have improved capabilities including the following:

- Paediatric scanning will now be available on site.
- Improved image quality: 160 slice (thickness of scan) vs current 16 slice. This provides improved diagnostic capabilities with enhanced detail in images.
- Produces 30 images per second; the improved efficiency offers shorter wait times and more patients scanned.
- Patients up to 650lbs can be scanned vs the current 350lbs max capacity.
- Improved radiation dose.

This campaign will be a multi-year campaign as we aim to raise \$950,000 to help cover the purchase and installation of the new machine.

Did you know?

CT Scanners provide radiologists with critical information to diagnose and treat a variety of disorders and illness. They:

- Quickly provides full body imaging in major trauma patients, detecting internal injuries and bleeding
- Diagnose muscle and bone disorders, such as bone tumours and fractures
- Pinpoint the location of tumours, infections or blood clots
- Guide procedures such as surgery, biopsy and radiation therapy

We need your help to keep this essential service and equipment available at your hospital.

Our Needs are Ongoing

The Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care cover on average, 80% of your hospital's operating costs. This limited funding for healthcare increases the financial pressure for your hospital in addition to the fact that none of this funding is designated to cover capital expenses. There is not a matching program from the Ministry to help purchase equipment, which leaves LWDHF to raise the funds needed, dollar for dollar.

Your hospital has identified over \$3 million in capital equipment and infrastructure needs over the next 2 years. The list shown to the right is a portion of what is needed by your hospital to ensure quality medical care remains available to your community at LWDH.

The items checked off on the list will be coming to your hospital soon!

Who is LWDHF?

The Lake of the Woods District Hospital Foundation was established in 1992 and continues to be the lifeline between your community and your hospital.

LWDHF is governed by an eleven member board which meets monthly; has two full time employees and benefits from over 2,000 volunteer hours per year.

We are dedicated to raising funds for the purchase of medical equipment and capital infrastructure. Since our inception, we have transferred over \$16.5 million to Lake of the Woods District Hospital (LWDH) which was initially constructed in 1929, and has received serveral additions over the years.
