YOUR IMPACT IN ACTION

The 2025–2026 fiscal year will be remembered as a defining chapter for the Lake of the Woods District Hospital Foundation (LWDHF) and for healthcare in our region.

This year, our community demonstrated what is possible when people come together with a shared commitment to local healthcare. Through remarkable generosity, volunteerism, and advocacy, supporters helped advance one of the most transformational periods in our Foundation's history.

The successful completion of the Beyond the Scan Campaign and the opening of the Diagnostic Imaging Centre of Excellence at the Lake of the Woods District Hospital marked a historic achievement for Kenora and surrounding communities. The arrival of our region's first MRI, alongside enhanced mammography services and soon, a new CT scanner, is already changing the experience of care for patients and families, improving access, reducing travel, and strengthening diagnostic services close to home.

Beyond diagnostic imaging, donor support enabled an additional \$3 million in equipment investments across the hospital this year. These enhancements touched nearly every area of care, supporting surgical services, emergency medicine, rehabilitation, patient comfort, and specialized clinical programs. Every investment reflects the belief that patients in Northwestern Ontario deserve access to modern, high-quality healthcare close to home.

The strength of philanthropy in our region was evident throughout the year. Community support for initiatives such as the Tree of Life Appeal, the Lifesavers Dinner & Auction, and countless third-party events continued to grow, bringing together individuals, businesses, healthcare staff, service clubs, and families in support of a shared mission.

This year also marked an important milestone within the Foundation itself as we expanded our team with the addition of two staff members. These new roles strengthen our ability to foster relationships, support fundraising growth, enhance community engagement, and prepare for the opportunities and responsibilities that will come with the future hospital redevelopment project.

As we look ahead, we do so with optimism and confidence. The momentum created this year extends far beyond equipment purchases or fundraising totals. It reflects a community investing in resilience, continuity of care, innovation, and the long-term future of healthcare in our region.

GIVING BACK TO THE CARE THAT SAVED HER LIFE

After a life-threatening emergency, Cheryl and Bill Gow witnessed first-hand the impact of skilled healthcare professionals, advanced medical equipment, and a community committed to care close to home.

For nearly three decades, Cheryl and Bill Gow supported local healthcare because they believed it was important.

Then local healthcare saved Cheryl's life.

In August 2023, Cheryl awoke suddenly in the middle of the night, unable to move her legs. Spending their summers on an island on Lake of the Woods, simply reaching care presented an immediate and daunting barrier. In the darkness, far from town, help felt distant. Yet within hours, she was in the Emergency Department at Lake of the Woods District Hospital (LWDH), facing a life-threatening ruptured brain bleed.

What followed was a remarkable demonstration of the power of care close to home.

Through diagnostic imaging and a timely, critical assessment, the healthcare team quickly identified

Cheryl's condition and began acting to save her life. As the urgency of her situation became clear, so too did the challenges. Larger centres could not immediately accept her. Still, the team at LWDH refused to stop. They advocated relentlessly, working behind the scenes to find a pathway forward until a transfer to Hamilton for specialized neurosurgical care was secured.

All the while, Cheryl's family watched a team move with focus, compassion, and determination.

"There was never any question about how hard they were working for Cheryl," recalls Bill. "When it's an emergency, the place works."

After being airlifted out of the region, Cheryl underwent two life-saving brain surgeries and spent 28 days in Hamilton. Bill and their daughter, Ali, rushed to be by her side, navigating travel and uncertainty alongside hope. Despite the distance, the connection to home—and to the care she first received—remained constant.



When Cheryl returned to Kenora, her recovery continued close to home. Against extraordinary odds, she regained her ability to stand and walk. Surrounded by family and supported by ongoing medical care, she began the long process of healing. Today, she continues with follow-up care locally and has benefited from MRI services now available in the community—care that once would have required travel far from home.

For the Gows, the experience profoundly reshaped their understanding of philanthropy in healthcare. They saw first-hand that community support is not simply helpful—it is essential. It ensures that healthcare teams have access to the tools, technology, and resources they need to act quickly, make critical diagnoses, and stabilize patients when every minute matters.

They witnessed the life-saving impact of diagnostic imaging, the skill and commitment of healthcare professionals, and the importance of having strong local care to bridge patients to the next stage of treatment. Equally, they came to understand how philanthropy helps make all of this possible—strengthening the system from within.

Inspired by that experience, Cheryl and Bill deepened their commitment through the creation of the ABC Gow Family Fund, named for Ali, Bill, and Cheryl. They also helped spark a broader community effort through Safety Bay Financial, where Bill serves as a Certified Financial Planner.

Together, they encouraged clients and supporters to give to the Beyond the Scan Campaign through their own matching initiative supported by Safety Bay Financial and the ABC Gow Fund.

The result was significant: \$50,802 raised - amplified by the FDC Foundation match challenge - to support vital diagnostic imaging equipment close to home.

For Cheryl, the impact of that care is simple and deeply personal.

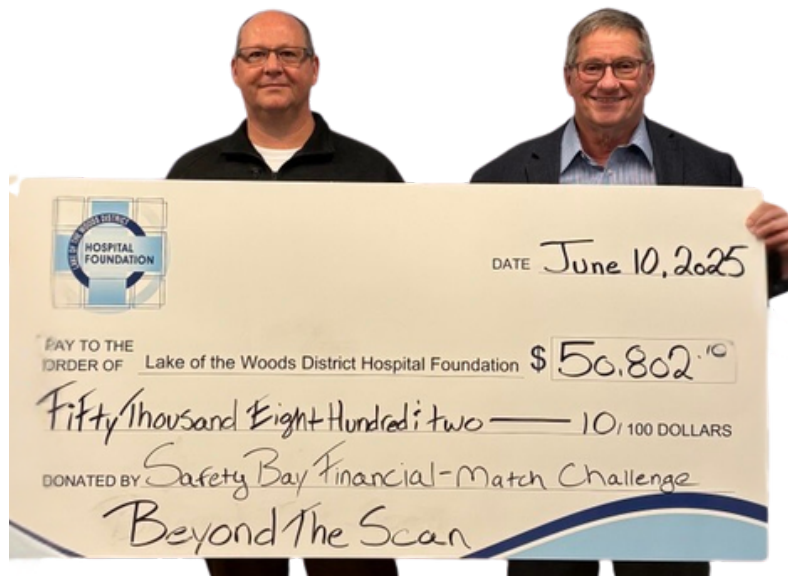
“The hospital saved my life,” she says.

A special Giving Tuesday event held on December 2, 2025 powered the Tree of Life, challenging the public with three participation-based *Match Challenges* to amplify the community's collective impact. A total of 195 gifts were donated either online, by mail, by phone, or in person - more than double last year's participation.

Donors did not simply meet every challenge, they doubled their contributions through the generosity of three local match donors: **Lake Country Financial Group** (\$1,000), **Kenora Optometry Clinic** (\$3,000), and **Northern Hearing Inc.** (\$5,000).

Altogether, Giving Tuesday raised \$36,970 towards an overall goal of \$60,000 to support the purchase of a video laryngoscope for the Emergency Department at Lake of the Woods District Hospital.

Additionally, this year's Tree of Life carried a special meaning as we remembered and honoured the appeal's founder, the late Alice Jardine. Through the purchase of every bulb, donors kept this cherished tradition alive, bringing our community together to honour, remember, and celebrate loved ones.

BEYOND THE SCAN UPDATE:

ADVANCING BREAST HEALTHCARE SERVICES AT LWDH

Donors to the Beyond the Scan Campaign are transforming breast healthcare services at Lake of the Woods District Hospital.

Thanks to the extraordinary generosity of our community, the campaign surpassed its ambitious \$8.5 million fundraising goal in record time, making possible a new era of advanced diagnostic imaging and surgical technology close to home. Combined with Ontario's decision to lower the recommended breast cancer screening age to 40, these investments are ensuring people across Northwestern Ontario have access to the same high-quality breast healthcare services available in larger centres.

From earlier detection and more accurate diagnosis to enhanced surgical precision, these advancements are reducing travel, accelerating access to care, and improving outcomes for patients and families across our region.

Earlier Detection

Early detection saves lives. Through the Beyond the Scan Campaign, LWDH has expanded access to advanced screening technology that can identify breast cancer sooner, often before symptoms appear.

Advanced Mammography Unit

Installed in November 2024, LWDH's new mammography system delivers exceptional image quality and incorporates several advanced technologies, including tomosynthesis (3D mammography), contrast-enhanced mammography, stereotactic biopsy capabilities, and AI-assisted diagnostics. Together, these innovations help detect breast cancer earlier and with greater confidence.

Tomosynthesis (3D Mammography)

Unlike a traditional mammogram, tomosynthesis captures multiple low-dose X-ray images to create a three-dimensional view of the breast. This technology improves the detection of small cancers—particularly in dense breast tissue—while reducing the need for repeat imaging and unnecessary patient recalls.

Providing Answers with Greater Confidence

When an abnormality is detected, timely and accurate diagnosis is essential. New technologies now available at LWDH provide clinicians with more information to guide care and reduce delays for patients.

Stereotactic Breast Biopsy

This minimally invasive, image-guided procedure allows radiologists to biopsy suspicious microcalcifications that are often too small to be felt or seen on ultrasound. By providing highly accurate tissue sampling, a stereotactic biopsy helps patients receive answers sooner while avoiding more invasive procedures whenever possible.

More Precise Treatment

When surgery is needed, advanced technology helps surgeons perform procedures with greater accuracy while supporting the best possible outcomes for patients.

SPY-PHI Portable Handheld Imager

Using fluorescence imaging technology, the SPY-PHI allows surgeons to visualize lymph nodes and lymphatic vessels in real time during breast cancer surgery. This enhanced visualization supports more precise surgical decision-making and improved lymphatic mapping.

MOLLI Magseed Localization System

Smaller than a grain of rice, the MOLLI Magseed is placed into a breast lesion before surgery to precisely mark its location. It can be placed 30 days prior to surgery, improving scheduling issues for patients and eliminating the need for out-of-town travel. During surgery, it guides the surgeon directly to the targeted tissue, improving surgical precision, supporting breast-conserving procedures where appropriate, and enhancing the patient experience.

Community Support. Lasting Impact.

Every advancement highlighted here has been made possible through the generosity of donors to the Beyond the Scan Campaign. Together, these investments are creating a comprehensive breast health program at LWDH, one that brings leading-edge technology, earlier detection, more accurate diagnosis, and more precise treatment closer to home.



Spy-Phi Handheld Imager

A MAMMOGRAM, A GUT FEELING, A LIFE POTENTIALLY SAVED

Sometimes the most important healthcare decisions begin with something difficult to explain.

No symptoms. No lump. No family history raising any alarm bells. Just a feeling.

For Shawnda, an Emergency Department nurse at the Lake of the Woods District Hospital (LWDH), that feeling came during a medical appointment for something entirely unrelated. At 44 years old, she had no reason to believe anything was wrong when she asked about getting a mammogram. That decision may have saved her life.

Shortly after the Ontario Breast Screening Program lowered the recommended screening age from 50 to 40, Shawnda booked her first mammogram at LWDH.

Her screening mammogram identified an area of concern. Thanks to the expertise of Dr. Catherine Murray, LWDH's Diagnostic Imaging team, and advanced breast screening technology now made available close to home, further imaging and biopsies were quickly coordinated. The diagnosis: *early-stage invasive ductal carcinoma*.

For anyone, it is a frightening diagnosis to hear. But because Shawnda's cancer was found through screening before symptoms appeared, it was detected at one of the earliest possible stages.

"If this had been found at 50 instead of 44," Shawnda reflects, "the journey and the outcome could have been very different. I can't stress how extremely blessed I am that it was caught."

Today, after undergoing surgery to remove her cancer, Shawnda is focused on the next phase of treatment: preventative radiation and medication to help ensure the cancer stays gone.

Her story is deeply personal, but it is also something larger.



While no cancer journey is easy, early detection meant treatment could begin sooner, with a significantly stronger prognosis and more options available to her.

Shawnda is, in many ways, a living example of why investments in healthcare matter. The upgraded imaging technology, accessible local care, and support of a dedicated healthcare team were not abstract concepts. They may have been the reason her cancer was found early enough to dramatically change her outcome.

It is a reminder that access matters. It is a testament to the impact that investments in healthcare technology can have on real people, real families, and real futures.

From screening to diagnosis, much of Shawnda's care happened right here in Kenora.



That local access reduced uncertainty, eliminated the need for extensive travel, and ensured she could move quickly from screening to answers.

While some appointments required travel, Shawnda remembers how difficult it felt to walk into unfamiliar environments and face rooms full of strangers. Returning home to Kenora made a difference.

"I knew I was in good hands," she says. She is deeply grateful to the physicians, nurses, technologists, and staff who supported her throughout her journey. The team went above and beyond to ensure she never felt alone, providing not only exceptional care, but comfort and reassurance when she needed it most.

Today, Shawnda is sharing her story for two reasons.

First, to encourage women to get screened. Breast cancer often develops without symptoms, and early detection remains one of the most powerful tools available.

Second, to help others understand that investments in healthcare are never just about equipment. They are about people.

By sharing her experience publicly, Shawnda has already found herself supporting others facing their own diagnoses.

Because of a mammogram, cancer was found before it had the opportunity to announce itself.

STRENGTHENING VISION CARE

LIONS CLUBS INVEST IN CATARACT SURGERY EQUIPMENT

In January 2026, the Lions Clubs of Northwestern Ontario, together with the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), made a \$142,400 investment in local vision care, funding a second Alcon Centurion cataract surgery system and supporting ophthalmology equipment for Lake of the Woods District Hospital (LWDH).

This contribution was shared equally between LCIF and participating local Lions Clubs, including Kenora Lake of the Woods, Ear Falls, Vermilion Bay, Dryden Trillium, Red Lake, Dryden, Sioux Lookout, and Ignace.

Following a significant flood event on May 6, 2026 that resulted in the temporary loss of operating room capacity, this investment remains a key component of LWDH's surgical recovery and long-term restoration plan. The Centurion system will support the re-establishment and expansion of cataract surgery services as surgical spaces are restored.

"Vision care has always been at the heart of what Lions do, and this project reflects Lions coming together to meet a growing need in our communities," said Rick Flavelle, Kenora Lake of the Woods Lions Club.

Prior to the flood, cataract surgery demand exceeded capacity at LWDH, with one operating room dedicated to procedures and approximately 12 surgeries performed daily. Equipment and space limitations contributed to longer wait times and out-of-region referrals.

Once surgical services are fully restored, the second Centurion system will significantly increase cataract surgery capacity. The technology supports high-volume procedures and efficient operating room turnover, improving surgical throughput while maintaining safety and precision.

The Alcon Centurion Vision System is an advanced cataract surgery platform that enhances outcomes through precise control of intraocular fluid dynamics, supporting both safety and efficiency.

Beyond capacity gains, the equipment provides operational redundancy, system compatibility, and continuity of care as services are restored. For patients across Northwestern Ontario, this investment will improve access to cataract surgery, reduce the need to travel outside the region, and strengthen local service capacity over the long term.

"Through their continued commitment to vision care, the Lions Clubs and LCIF are making a meaningful difference for patients and families across Northwestern Ontario," said Cheryl O'Flaherty, President and CEO of LWDH.

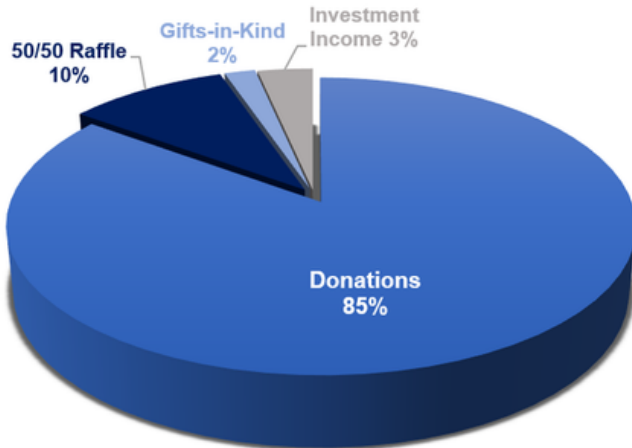

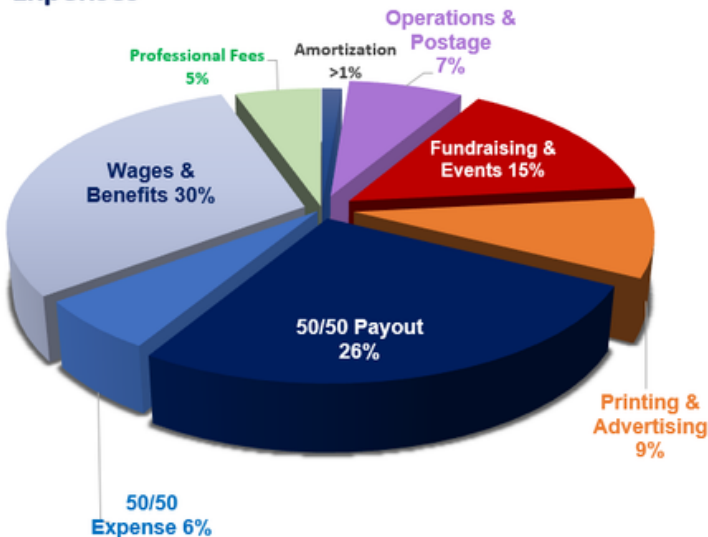

This past fiscal year was marked by incredible generosity toward the Foundation's most ambitious capital campaign to date. While the majority of gifts supported this transformative effort, designated contributions to other priorities also made an important impact. Together, every donation, regardless of size, helped advance patient care at LWDH and ensured the hospital's highest-priority equipment needs were met.
